

National Tsing Hua University Emmanuel O Salawu Scholarship Regulations

I. Purpose: To encourage and cultivate outstanding graduate students with research potential to engage in research and development in the following areas — [A] computational biology, smart healthcare, and theoretical physical chemistry within the fields of life sciences and biomedicine, and [B] other areas of science, technology, and engineering — Dr. Emmanuel O. Salawu and National Tsing Hua University have established these regulations.

II. Source of Scholarships: Dr. Emmanuel O Salawu will donate to Tsing Hua University through the Tsing Hua North America Foundation an amount (plus 10% management fee) determined in accordance with Article III of these regulations before the month of June each year, in equivalent US dollars.

III. Number and Amount of Scholarships: Each academic year (from September to the following August), two master's students and two doctoral students shall be selected as scholarship awardees. Among these four awardees, at least one master's student and at least one doctoral student must be conducting research within the fields listed under Category [A] in Article I. In exceptional cases where the Selection Committee determines that there are no sufficiently strong applicants in Category [A], this requirement may be waived. The remaining awardees may conduct research in any of the fields listed under Category [A] or Category [B] in Article I. Each doctoral student awardee shall receive NT\$15,000 per month for twelve months, and each master's student awardee shall receive NT\$7,000 per month for twelve months.

IV. Eligibility: Graduate students of National Tsing Hua University who are engaged in research and development in the areas listed under Article I. Doctoral students can be supported for a maximum of four years, and master's students can be supported for a maximum of two years.

V. Timeline: The Academic Affairs Office will send a letter to relevant departments and announce the application process at the end of June each year.

VI. Application Method: Within the announced application period, prepare the following documents (in English) and submit them directly to the **Academic Affairs Office**. (1) Application form. (2) Research topic and a 300-word summary. (3) Any additional supporting documents such as publication(s), presentation(s) at conference(s), etc. When reapplying, the awardee should briefly describe the preliminary research results.

VII. Selection Method: A committee will be formed by the Academic Affairs Office to review and approve the applications. The selection results will be notified to the donor in writing.

VIII. Scholarship Disbursement: The scholarship will be disbursed monthly at the beginning of each month and will be discontinued after the student graduates or takes a leave of absence.

IX. Personal Data Usage Statement: By applying for this scholarship, the applicant agrees that the university and the donor may collect, use, and process the applicant's personal data in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Act for the purpose of administering the scholarship.

X. Responsibilities of the Awardee: (1) The awardee shall send electronic copies of the master's or doctoral thesis, conference papers, and journal papers to the donor for

retention. (2) The awardee shall acknowledge the assistance of this scholarship in the acknowledgements of the doctoral or master's thesis or published papers.

XI. Change in Eligibility if Awardee Receives Other Scholarships: The awardee of this scholarship can NOT concurrently receive other scholarships that provide additional total benefits up to or more than 200% of the benefits this scholarship offers.

XII. These regulations shall be implemented after being approved by the donor and the signed by the Vice President for Academic Affairs, Prof. Yi-Wen Liu.
